



This reflects a strong commitment to further education among the student body. Additionally, 2 (1.6%) students have chosen to take a year or more off before pursuing higher education, while 4 students (3.12%) will be balancing work commitments alongside their studies.






THEOLOGY OF THE BODY

TRACK AND FIELD



Saint Catherine Academy Track Team left an indelible mark at the CSSSA Regional Track and Field competition on April 19 and 20, 2024. They delivered an exceptional performance, showcasing their tremendous potential on the track and in the field. Keniyah Flowers, a standout athlete, claimed first in the 100m, 200m, long jump, and high jump in senior and junior divisions. Nyasha Harris electrified the crowd, placing first in 100m and 200m for seniors and second in the long jump for the seniors division. Imyra Banks placed third in the long jump, and Kaley Geban was second in the high jump. Nayrelli **López** displayed endurance with her impressive fourth place in the 3k and 1500m races. **Emaun Marin's** dynamic performance highlighted her first place in the 400m and triple jump, alongside second place in the 800m. Aveleen Rodríguez scored third in javelin and fourth in discus. Gyzell Aldana defeated her competition, placing

first in the junior division and second for senior in Discus. Gia Jones's impressive throw earned her second place in javelin, and Amelia Coleman excelled, finishing second place in Shot Put. The girl's achievement tallied with 10 gold medals, 5 silver, and 2 bronze that impelled Coordinator SCA in a commendable fourth place.


